

The Sub-Fund may invest in financial derivative instruments, including but not limited to FX forwards, for hedging and efficient portfolio management purposes.The Sub-Fund will not use efficient portfolio management techniques or Total Return Swaps (TRS). Risk indicator

However, investors may suffer loss if the Sub-Fund or the depositary is unable to pay out. There is no compensation or guarantee scheme in place which may offset, all or any, of this loss.

Cost over time

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MY MONEY OUT EARLY?

The recommended minimum holding period: 5 years.
